Sodamix Concentrate Samples

Introduction

Someone interested in trying my 16-oz sodamix concentrate wrote to me that the full-size bottles are too expensive when all he wanted to do was try it out. So I decided to offer sample-size bottles, which can be much cheaper mostly because shipping is much less.

The sample-size bottles are 2 oz and make a pint of sodamix, which in turn makes about 8 liters of soda. That's about the same as one bottle of most Sodastream flavors. My big bottles of concentrate are a better deal but cost more per bottle.

Mixing Instructions

Sodamix requires a small amount of preservative, sugar or sugar-free sweetener, and flavor concentrate. Be sure to shake the concentrate before using it. For making a sample, you can leave out the preservative if you keep the resulting sodamix in the refrigerator.

Use the recipe on the accompanying instruction sheet. A sample-size bottle makes a pint of sodamix, so divide the amounts in the recipe by half, since the recipe makes a quart.

You can mix up your sodamix in a 500ml Sodastream flavor bottle if you have one handy.

More Information

If you like the sample, full-size bottles are available at a reasonable price. They make about 4 quarts (8 Sodastream-size bottles) of sodamix, or roughly 64 liters of soda.
